The Bristol Borough School District's Health and Safety Plan is informed by guidance from our federal, state, and local authorities. These include and are not limited to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PADOH), the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), and the Bucks County Health Department (BCHD).

The Bristol Borough School District will continue to work in coordination with these agencies and our local partners to develop and refine expectations that meet all requirements based on community spread and other pertinent factors.

The Bristol Borough School District will revise this plan as necessary, based on changing guidance at any of these levels, at the required frequency. Such changes will be communicated to all stakeholders

1. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

The Bristol Borough School District will provide in-person instruction during the 2021-2022 school year very similar to pre-pandemic conditions. The Bristol Borough School District Virtual Academy will be available to students who are unable to attend in-person school.

The Bristol Borough School District will maintain the ability to pivot to remote or hybrid instruction if local conditions warrant the need to change modes of instruction.

The Bristol Borough School District will continue to provide social, emotional, and mental health services and interventions for all students in the following ways:

- Implement an MTSS Academic/Social/Behavioral Support Model for grades K-5.
- Utilize the established PBIS system to support the MTSS model and establish a

PBIS initiative at the middle school.

- Initiate services through Family Services to bring school based family and individual counseling to students.
- Increase social work and other supportive services such as speech, PT and OT.
- Train all faculty in Mental Health First Aid.
- Provide middle school students with access to NAMI counseling services and the CORE curriculum based on social emotional learning.
- Utilize the K-12 SAP program to provide assistance for students in need.
- Provide after school and summer sessions to mitigate learning loss.
- Provide opportunities for middle and high school students to participate in credit recovery.
- Continue to provide additional supports to meet the needs of special populations, through the IEP/504 process and/or through our multi-tiered system of support.
- continue to provide training, time, support, and flexibility necessary for staff to prepare for successful instruction via the Staff Developer/Instructional Coach Model.
- Foster a culture of student-centered learning and best instructional proactive through the AVID model for grades 7-12.
- Continue to provide clear and accurate communication to all families and staff.
- Continue to offer supports to staff through professional development and common planning time whenever feasible.
- Utilize universal screeners and benchmarks to assess student progress and provide data informed instruction to meet the needs of all learners.
- Implement new core reading and mathematics programs in grades K-8 with build in interventions and remediation strategies.
- Implement new online programs for academic support in core areas.
- Provide free lunch to all students through the SSO Program.

Universal and correct wearing of masks;	Revised August 24, 2021: On Bristol Borough School District and BBSD-Contracted Vehicles: The CDC requires that passengers and drivers must wear a mask on school buses, including on buses operated by public and private school systems, subject to the exclusions and exemptions in the CDC's Order. A driver does not need to wear a mask if they are the only person on the vehicle. As of August 17, 2021, the Bucks County Health Department supports masking on buses at the current time, subject to regular, ongoing review. In all other situations, including Bristol Borough School District classrooms and work locations: Masks are required for all individuals in all indoor Bristol Borough School District classrooms and work locations at the current time and subject to regular, ongoing review for the following reasons: • On August 17, 2021, the Bucks County Health Department issued updated guidance on masking to follow CDC
	guidance on masking in schools at the current time and subject to regular, ongoing review. • Per The BCHD on August 17, 2021, Bucks County is now considered to be an area of high transmission specific to COVID-19.
	 Federal and state health authorities recommend that the Bristol Borough School District implement a 'mask required' policy at the current time in alignment with CDC guidance for schools. The correct wearing of masks includes covering both the nose and
	the mouth. Masks are not required outdoors and remain optional. The Bristol Borough School District will continue to honor all
b. Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	approved mask exemptions. The Bristol Borough School District will rely on best practices, informed by federal, state, and local guidance, to design and implement high-quality, student-centered instructional environments. Specifically, the Bristol Borough School District will continue to rely on the BCHD's, PDH's and the CDC's guidance to design safe instructional and work spaces for all individuals. Classroom spaces will be modified accordingly if there is a change in local, state or federal guidance. Current guidance recommends maintaining a distance of 3 feet between individuals whenever possible.

c. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	All individuals will continue to encouraged and reminded to sanitize or wash their hands on a frequent basis. Hand sanitizer will continue to be made available in all common areas, hallways, and/or lobby areas where sinks for handwashing are not available, in order to encourage frequent use. The Bucks IU will continue to post signs in highly visible locations that promote everyday protective measures/hygiene and how to stop the spread of germs. The Bristol Borough School District will continue to include proper personal hygiene in program curricula.
d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation;	The Bristol Borough School District will continue to follow proper cleaning and sanitizing protocols following CDC, EPA, and manufacturer guidelines. Ventilation remains as a component of available strategies to clean and maintain healthy facilities. On-site maintenance staff will perform cleaning of high-touch items. Hand sanitizing stations have been installed and will continue to be maintained throughout key areas of the building. All cleaning products utilized are approved on the EPA COVID-19 approved sanitization products list, following the approved
	application standards. Additional cleaning/disinfecting products are available for staff use as needed - disinfectant wipes, hand sanitizer, hand soap, and paper towels.

Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State and local health departments;	Per BCHD guidance issued August 15, 17, & 23,2021: ● Per the PADOH, schools should continue to work closely with BCHD to complete contact tracing for individuals diagnosed or exposed to COVID-As part of the contact tracing process, the PADOH and BCHD will continue to work with schools to gather information about potential close contacts. CDC guidance adds the following exception to the definition of close contact: o In the K−12 indoor classroom setting, the close contact definition excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) where:

	Whether symptomatic or asymptomatic, any individual who tests positive for COVID-19 must isolate for 10 days as both symptomatic and asymptomatic individuals can transmit the virus during that time.

Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities;	 The Bristol Borough School District will continue to educate all stakeholders (students, staff, parents/guardians) on the signs and symptoms of COVID-19. All students and parents/guardians are encouraged to perform a symptom screening before arriving at school or the bus stop each day. Students, teachers, and staff who have symptoms of infectious illness, such as influenza (flu) or COVID-19, are recommended to stay home and be referred to their healthcare provider for testing and care. Students and staff are expected to report to the nurse immediately if feeling symptomatic. The Bristol Borough School District will use the CDC guidance (BCHD where determined to be applicable) for students who become sick or report a new COVID case while at school. The District will continue to share resources with the school community to help families understand when to keep children home. BCHD and The Bristol Borough School District collaboration: The Bristol Borough School District will work with BCHD for assistance, resources, and funding to support rapid testing protocols for symptomatic individuals to keep schools open Please Note: All processes and procedures are based upon evaluation and current conditions/circumstances and may be adjusted as necessary or as the result of new information. The Bristol Borough School District will continue ongoing coordination with the BCHD, local pharmacies, and local physicians to host vaccination clinics in our schools and provide awareness of community-based vaccination opportunities for students and staff. BCHD & The Bristol Borough School District unequivocally recommends that everyone eligible get vaccinated because vaccines are safe, effective, and the best tool we have to mitigate COVID-19. BCHD recommends that school districts consider mandating vaccination for all school staff and teachers, a position supported by National Education Association (NEA) and American Federation of Teac
